# The Second Epistle of John

#### **AUTHORSHIP**

- 1. Traditionally assigned to the Apostle John
- 2. The writer identifies himself only as "the elder"

#### **RECIPIENTS**

The chosen lady and her children - possibly a particular Christian church and its members (daughter of Zion and Bride of Christ)

Further indicated by the singular pronouns in verses 1 through 5 and 13, replaced with the plural, emphasizing the group in verses 6-12

#### **CONDITIONS**

requiring the writing of the letter (same as First John)

1. anti-christs (deceivers)

vs7 with 1 Jn 2:18,22

2. guilt of denying the person of Christ

vs7 with 1 Jn 2:22-23; 4:1-3

3. the need to "walk in His commands and walk in love" vs5-6 with 1 Jn 2:3-9; 3:14-18,23; 4:7, 11, 20-21

## **DATE**

Assumed to be at the same time as First John

Was written because of the circumstances or conditions which existed at the time of the writing

### <u>TEXT</u>

Preamble vs1-3

The identity of the writer and the recipients
Stresses the two major concerns of the letter - TRUTH and LOVE
Offers a greeting

# **SECOND JOHN**

Vs1 The chosen church; its members
whom John loves as do all who know the truth
1 Tim 3:15
1. chosen - because its members are chosen
Eph 1:4

2. apparently known by a significant number of believers 1Thess 1:8-10 (similar situation)

Vs2 the truth known and cherished which

1. abides in us

2. will be with us forever

1Jn 1:8-9 We <u>all</u> have come to understand the truth, and cling to it as our only hope Jn14:16-18

Vs3 Verse 2 TRUTH - will be with us forever
Verse 3 GRACE, MERCY, PEACE - will also be with us
which comes from

1. God the Father

2. Jesus Christ, the Son of the Father

Vs4 I was very glad1Jn 1:4

children (members) - walking in truth

just as we have received commandment from the Father

Vs5-6 And now I ask you...

that we love one another...

that we walk according to His commandments...

the commandment..... you should walk in it.

This has been the teaching from the beginning.

1Jn 2:7

What does it mean "to love"? 1Jn3:16-18

Who am I to love? 1Jn5:1-3

Vs7-11 Many deceivers have gone out...who do not acknowledge the Incarnation. 1Tim 3:16

This is the deceiver; the anti-christ

Vs 8 Watch yourselves - that you:

1. might not lose what we have accomplished

2. that you may receive a full reward

Vs9 The one who does not <u>abide</u> in the teaching of Christ

1. goes too far

2. does not have God

The one who <u>abides</u> in the teaching has both the Father and the Son

NOTE: Believers can lose their full reward.

The threat is loss of a full reward -

**NOT DAMNATION** 

2Tim2:17,18 (Hymenaeus)

1Tim 1:19-20 "learn" God's discipline of His own

children

1 Cor 11:32; Heb 12:6-10; 1Cor 5:5

QUESTION: Is "loss of salvation" the only thing that frightens us?

Vs10-11 There is no other teaching that is acceptable than this teaching

If someone teaches other than this:

1. They are a deceiver

2. They are anti-christ

- 3. They are not to be received into our house
- 4. They are not to be greeted, which amounts to participating in their godless deeds
- 5. "Greeting" is more than saying "hello" It is rejoicing in their message QUESTION: What is the teaching they do not bring? ANSWER: Jesus is God, manifest in the flesh.
- Vs 12 John had much more to say (write) but preferred face to face communications
- Vs 13 If John was writing to a literal woman, he would have sent her greetings.

The children of the sister would again indicate that a church is the entity referred to here.
