THE BOOK OF REVELATION INTRODUCTION AUTHOR: THE APOSTLE JOHN

External Evidence

1. Irenaeus (120-200) quotes every chapter of the book.

2. Tertullian (160-222) likewise, quotes almost every chapter and states that the Apostle John was the author.

3. Hippolytus (170-236) quotes extensively from chapters 17 & 18, also attributing the book to John.

4. Clement of Alexandria (155-220) and Origen (186-253) both agree, with both

confirming the Apostle was on the Isle of Patmos Rev 1:9.

Eusubius (260-340) dates John's return from the Isle as

immediately following the death of Domitian, which occurred in AD 96.

5. Irenaeus stated that John lived in Ephesus after returning from Patmos until the reign of Trojan (98-117).

6. His authorship was never questioned until the 3rd century AD.

<u>Internal Evidence</u>

Rev 1:1, 4, 9: 22:8

Time of the Writing

Taking the above historical references as true, John would have

written the book in AD96 or 97. The death of Domitian by

assassination occurred in AD96 and the Apostle was said to be

released from his exile shortly after this.

Circumstances of the Writing

While on the Isle of Patmos, John received his visions and was told

to write them in a book and send these writings to seven specific churches. Rev 1:9-11

How We Will Handle The Text

<u>We will not</u>

-treat the text as a record of the conflicts of the early church with Judaism and paganism ending with a contemporary triumph of the Church.

-nor will we treat it as a description of persecution; that was experienced by the first century Christians.

<u>We will</u>

handle the text as futuristic at the time of John's writing and chapters 4:1 – end, as still futuristic in our day.

We will also treat the book by interpreting it literally, even while recognizing the frequent symbolism used, hence handling these symbols and their interpretation as being fulfilled in a normal way.

For example:

1. The various judgments of God are actually poured out on the earth as described in the seals, trumpets, and bowls.

2. Chapter 13 is a prophecy of the future world empire with 2 humans heading up both the political and religious institution, they being described as two beasts.

3. The harlot of chapter 17 is a real operating apostate church which will reach its apex during the literal 7 year (84 months of 30 days each, 2520 days) tribulation period.

4. All the events described (Rev 4:1-ff) relate to the climax of human history. Rev 2:1 – 3:22 describe both the conditions of seven literal churches which existed in John's day and are prophetic of the church age which began at the day of Pentecost and is about to end with the Rapture.

The Island of Patmos is a rocky island 10 miles long and 6 miles wide in the Aegean Sea, southwest of Ephesus.

The early Church Fathers record that John, who was very old at the time, was exiled to work the mines there by Domitian.

It was under these difficult conditions that God revealed to John the end of the world that now is. Note:

- 1. Moses wrote the Pentateuch in the wilderness while the generation he led out of Egypt all dropped dead.
- 2. David wrote many of his Psalms while being pursued by Saul.
- 3. Isaiah lived in the worst of times for Israel and ended

up dying a martyr's death.

- 4. Ezekiel wrote in exile while his nation remained in captivity.
- 5. Jeremiah's life was one of trial and persecution.
- 6. Peter wrote his two letters shortly before martyrdom.
- 7. Paul ended his life early awaiting execution.

All of the above, because of the word of God and the world's dislike and intolerance of it, John experienced in his life for the testimony of Jesus.

Vs 10-11 John was taken beyond his normal state into a state where God could reveal the contents of this book.

Such an experience was not common, but did occur.

What God hates, the Christian ought to hate as well. The modern tendency to blur distinctions of moral and

theological truth has lead the Church and its' people down the path to where we find ourselves today.

When becoming Christian becomes popular, the conscience of the Church quickly blurs.

When there is no difference between being a part of the church and being a part of the world, maintaining biblical doctrine becomes difficult. Replacing the Bible with Psychology and/or philosophy (paperback Christianity) often becomes the beginning of the end

Note: We are not sure who the Nicolatians were. Some believe that they were followers of Nicolas (possibly the same man named in Acts 6:5).

The early Church Fathers mentioned a sect which advocated "license" in the area of conduct that were known by this name.

Vs 7 Hearing followed by action is what God is desiring (demanding- their lampstand will be removed.)

Though the message is directed to the church and the church's continuation is determined by its response; the ultimate effect will be upon the individuals who make up the church. Overcomers will be recognized!

As to the Tree of Life — it is first found in the Garden of Eden, (Gen 3:22), and is later found in the new Jerusalem.

From Revelation, chapter 22, it would appear that prospering in the millennium is the result that overcomers can anticipate. Elsewhere all true Christians are said to be overcomers. 1 Jn 5:4-5

THE CHURCH IN SMYRNA – Vs 8 – 11

The apostolic church of the first century with all the power and prestige brought to it by the apostolic presence was replaced by a suffering church that continued until Constantine reigned in the beginning of the 4th century. Jesus Christ describes Himself as the eternal God who has always existed in The past and will always exist in the future. He is also the One "who became

Dead" and He is the one who lives because of His own resurrection.

Vs 9 He assures them that He <u>knows</u> of their oppression by their enemies and their abject poverty (having been robbed of their goods in the process of their persecution.)

THE CHURCH IN PERGAMUM – Vs 12-17

Vs 12 Christ has the sword, the two-edged one, the sharp one. (The Word of God) Rev 1:16; 2:12,16; 19:15,21; Heb 4:12 (The Word of God is that which will judge. Jn 12:47-48)

As to the sword being double edged:

1. It separates the vessels of grace from condemnation. It cuts loose the chains of sin which bind us.

- 2. This same word becomes the means of condemnation for those who reject the grace of God.
- Vs 13 Pergamum is said to be the place where Satan's throne is...where Satan dwells..

The people of this city worshipped two successive religions which used the serpent as a symbol. The first referred to its deity as the serpent god.

- Asklepious was the god of healing. Snakes and the handling of reptiles was central to the worship.
 - A Pergamum coin shows the emperor Caracalla standing with a spear in one hand before a great serpent entwined around a branch.
- Another archeological find describes the same god enthroned with a staff in one hand and the other on the head of a serpent.
- 2. An altar to Zeus was discovered in 1871. This altar bears the inscription dedicating it to "Zeus the Savior".

Christ commends them that in spite of their evil environment the Christians have held fast to His Name and not denied the faith. Eph 4:4-6 These believers were holding fast even though one of theirs, Antipas, had been killed. Heb 12:3-4

Pergamum also became involved with emperor worship (imperial cult) during the Roman period. Tradition says that Antipas died by burning in a brazen bull during Domitians' reign.

Whatever the meaning of the white stone or the name that is written, it seems to signify Christ's favor to the overcomers and is recorded as a motivation to those who find themselves in an historical situation where a decision must be made to stand on the truth and separate from the compromisers that surround them.

THE CHURCH IN THYATIRA – Vs 18-29

Vs 18

To this church the one speaking is the "Son of God" rather than the "Son of Man" (Rev 1:13) 1. Son of God a. Christ referred to Himself as "Son of Man" far more often that He did "Son of God". b. He accepted the title whenever it was used by others and the fact that He declared Himself to be so became the basis for the Jewish leaders to charge Him with blasphemy in His trial. Lk 22:67-71 c. Also note: Jn 10:31-33 d. As the "Son of God" in John's gospel >He has life in Himself just as the Father does. Jn 5:26 >He must be honored in the same way as the Father is. Jn 5:23 >On the Divine side He has a Father and on the human side He has a God. Jn 20:17 e. Christ's resurrection declares His Deity - Rom 1:1-4 2. Son of Man – a. Christ almost universally referred to Himself by this title Matthew – 30 times Mark – 15 times Luke – 25 times John – 12 times b. Hebrews tells us why the title Heb 2:17-18 along with Mk 10:45 One would suppose that Christ used this name because it is appropriate for the situation that the Church of Thyatira has put herself in.

See the notes on Rev 1:14-15 concerning His eyes and His feet

Vs 19	Christ commends the Church for her deeds, love, faith, service, and perseverance, and that they are increasing over time unlike the Church in Ephesus. Rev 2:4-5		
	 Note: When considering the Indictment, this Church is considered to be the Church of the Middle Ages. 1. This Church sought to combine Christianity with the pagan religions it came in contact with, absorbing the ceremonies of these religions into Christianity. 2. They began exalting Mary to the role of deity and that of co-redeemer, teaching that intercession to God must be made through her. 3. Idols in the form of religious statues were introduced. 4. - 3. Those who "pass the test" will participate in the 1000 years, ruling with and for Christ.

Note: As to God's focus throughout the 1000 year reign, see my notes.

Vs 28 Verse 26 "To Him I will give authority over the nations", as a quotation from Ps 2:8, is a reference to Christ reigning, not believers!

If the intent is to speak of believers reigning, then 2 things are said of them:

1. They will be given authority over the nations 2. They will be given the "morning star" If the first refers to Christ, then the second stands alone as a promise to him who over comes, who keeps Christ's deeds.

> Morning Star: 2 Pet 1:16-19 When the morning star arises in our hearts, Jer 31:31-34 will be fulfilled. Rev 22:16 Jn 14:21

Final Thought: Is there a difference in glory, star from star? 1 Cor 15:39 - 41 Is there a difference between those who "know" Jesus in eternity?

THE BOOK OF REVELATION CHAPTER 3

The Church in Sardis - Vs.1-6

Vs. 1 - Jesus describes Himself with the same terminology He used to introduce Himself to the seven churches - Rev.1:4,16. The seven spirits who stand before Him in the Rev.1:4 are said to rest on Him in Is.11:2-5; Rev.5:7.

1) Spirit of the Lord

2) Spirit of wisdom and understanding

3) Spirit of council and strength

4) Spirit of knowledge and the fear of the Lord

He is qualified to judge righteously, and He will judge the church in Sardis. The leaders of the churches are held in Christ's hand, which means that they are responsible to Christ and will be required to give an account to the Lord Himself.

This church has a reputation - a name - the world is unimpressed, but Christ knows their deeds - that they are really dead!

NOTE: There is no commendation for this church, just judgment if she doesn't wake up - a church with a name, but no real substance; Successful in the world's eyes but empty in Gods.

Vs. 2 - <u>Wake up</u> (as a church) Eph.5:15-17 esp. vs.14 (as individual members of the church). Strengthen the things that remain, which are dying. Their works are not achieving God's will - Heb.10:7-10.

Vs. 3 - Remember

- 1) what you have received Lk.12:48
- 2) heard
- 3) keep it "and"
- 4) repent

If you will not wake up, I will come like a thief at an hour you won't expect -Mt.24:42-44; 25:13; I Thes.5:2-6; 2 Pet.3:10. (It will always be unexpected when we live not expecting).

Vs. 4 - Invitation and promise to the godly remnant. The white garment is the righteousness of the saints - not the righteousness of God - Rev.19:8. Character and service will ultimately be manifested outwardly.

Vs. 5 - To the overcomers (there are overcomers in every church).

1) white garments Rev.4:4; 6:11; 7:9,14.

2) name remains in the "book of life" - Ex.32:32-35; Ps.69:22- 28; Rev.13:7-9;

17:8; 20:15; 21:27.

3) confessed before Christ's Father

4) confessed before Christ's angels - Lk.12:8-9.

Vs. 6 - He who has an ear!

THE CHURCH IN PHILADELPHIA - VS.7-13

Vs.7 - He who is Holy - definition - God, morally perfect - I Jn.1:5; I

Tim.6:14-16. What are the implications for us?

NOTE: The God of Israel is called "the Holy one of Israel" - Is.1:4; 5:24 etc... Is.6:1-5.

"The Holy one of Israel" is Jacob's Redeemer! Is.41:14; 43:14.

"The Holy one of Israel" is Israel's God and Savior - Is.43:3.

He is Israel's King - Is.43:15.

There is no God but Him - Is.45:5-7, 21-25.

He will enter the human race - Is.9:6 to save - Is.52:14; 53:1-12; Lk.1:26-35.

He will reign from David's throne - Is.9:7; Rev.19:11-16.

This one who is "the Holy one of Israel" in the O.T. is Jesus Christ in the N.T. For there is only one who is Holy - Lv.11:44-45; I Pet.1:14-16 (good Mt.19:16-17)

He who is Holy is the one writing to the seven churches.

He who is true - Jn.1:1, 14, 17; 5:30-34; 8:31-32, 44-47; 14:6 (Mt.22:16) Jn.19:35.

Pilate asked the question - Jn.18:38. John has given us the answer - Jn.19:35.

God planned it this way - Jn.14:25-26; l Jn.1:1-3.

He who has the key of David - Is.22:15-25esp. vs.22 and 23.

Historical Reference:

1) Shebna - steward who is in charge of the royal household will be replaced by Eliakim - vs.15, 19-20.

- 2) The God of Israel will
 - a) clothe him vs.21
 - b) give him authority vs.21

c) the key of the house of David will be set upon his

shoulder - Lord keeper vs.22

1) He will control the wealth of the house of Judah.

2) He will control the positions filled within that house.

3) He will be second only to the king.

3) Jesus Christ is the Head of the coming house to be built, all

wealth and position will come from Him!

Vs. 8 - Our entire life lays open before His eyes - not what we have

believed but rather what we have done.

In the context of this statement, it is the church as a body which is being spoken of.

There is a "body life" as well as an individual life; A joint testimony.

Christ has put before this body of believers an open door - no one can shut it, and they must walk through it!

The open door would not lead the body into...

1) political power

2) a social gospel

3) defending the weak

Christ's open door would lead... This body of believers has "a little power" (No word of rebuke – their "little strength" forms the basis for their commendation.) 1) They have kept my Word 2) have not denied My name

Vs. 9 - Behold, I will cause those who bear the name "Jews" (should have rejoiced in my saving work in their life, should have known - Rom.9:1-5; Eph.2:11-22; Rom.2:17-29).

Bear the name that connects them with me and yet they belong to "the synagogue of Satan" - Jn.16:1-3 (manifesting the outward markings of Christianity but not possessing the inward life makes you an automatic member of Satan's church - there is no in between position).

<u>lie</u> - Jesus doesn't hold back on His judgments; liberals are not another branch of the church, they lie, they belong to Satan.

There is a promise to those who have possessed even "a little power". 1) Those who have belonged to Satan's synagogue will be made to come and bow down at their feet.

2) made to know - the Jesus Christ who has loved them.

- NOTE: It won't happen to them in this life time, but there is an eternity to come and it will happen! Phl.12:5-11; Rom.8:14-18.
- Vs. 10 Because you have ... I will...
 - 1) "kept the Word" which is the foundation perseverance rests upon - Rom.15:4.
 - 2) "hour of testing" Mt.24:9-28; Ezk.20:33-44; Rev.6:1 19:7.
 - 3) "keep you from"
 - a) There is a difference between being kept from and kept through the hour. The 144,000 (Rev 7:1-8) are kept through
 - while the church of ... is kept from (pre tribulation rapture).
 - b) The church John. wrote to has all died and none of them will experience the hour. This argues that the church of Philadelphia is a prophetic type of a (the) church that will be in existence when the tribulation occurs.
 - c) Believers during the tribulation will experience the full effect of that hour - Rev.6:9-11. This would argue that believers of the tribulation are not a part of the church; Israel is Satan's focus and there is no indication that they will be a part of the church.

For these believers will be delivered out of the tribulation to prosper throughout the millennium.

Rev.12:1-17; Rom.11:25-29. Mt. 25 speaks of the humans who will be invited to enter the kingdom; Jews and Gentiles are the only people mentioned. (also note Deut.30:3-9). All of the above argues for a pre-tribulation rapture.

- NOTE: Some additional reasons for a pre-tribulation rapture:
- 1) The "trial" that is to come upon the earth is directed toward "Jacob" (Israel), not the church - Jer.30:7.
- 2) Daniel's 70th week is about Daniel's People and his city -Dan.9:27; 12:1.
- 3) Revelation 6-18 speaks about it in detail, never mentioning the church unlike Rev.1:1 - 3:22.
 - 4) It is stated as a time to test "those who dwell upon the earth", not the church -

Rev.3:10, 6:10; 8:13; 11:10; 13:8, 12, 14; 14:6; 17:2, 8.

- 5) Christ's bride (church) is seen as being in heaven, clothed, before the return of Christ occurs Rev.19:7-9.
- 6) Also see II Thess.2:1-12 and I Thess.4:13-18.
- Vs. 11 (Remember II Pet.3:9-15).
- Vs. 12 To the overcomer this blessing:
 - 1) He will become a pillar in the temple of Christ's God.
 - Free pillar cannot be taken literally because there is no temple in the new Jerusalem - Rev.21:22. It must, therefore, be intended to visualize a spiritual reality.
 - a) a place of prominence Gal.2:9.
 - b) experience permanence, security, and position in God's eternal home (never to go out again) 2 Chr.3:15-17. Just as the kingdom cannot be shaken, - Heb.12:28 - neither will the overcomers be shaken.
 - 2) Three names will be written upon them.
 - a) the name of Christ's God Num.6:24-27; Jer.33:14-16.
 - b) the name of the City of Christ's God Rev.21:9-10;
 - 22:14; Heb.12:22-24.
 - c) Christ's new name Rev.2:17.
- Vs. 13 He who has an ear...

THE CHURCH IN LAODICEA - VS.14-22

- Vs. 14 The Amen "so be it" of God He is sovereign and His
 - promises will be fulfilled 2 Cor.1:20. When Christ speaks, it is the final word; the faithful and true witness to the church which is neither faithful nor true. 1) the faithful witness - Rev.1:5.

2) He who is true - Rev.3:7.

That which He is about to tell this church can be "taken to the bank".

The beginning of the creation of God - He is the source - It does not mean that Jesus was the very first being created by God. (See our notes on Rev.1:5; Jn.1:3; Col.1:15,18; Heb.1:2) says this.

Vs. 15 - 16 - Note that there is no commendation for this church, i.e...

nothing good to say (If we are living in the last days, this either is or is becoming our church).

The head of the Laodicean church during the life of Paul was Archippus -Col.4:15-17 around 61AD. John is writing around 95 or 96AD. What must have happened to this church over 35 years?

Three states of the church are given.

1) Cold - the gospel leaves them unmoved and arouses no interest in the things of God.

2) Hot - on fire for Christ - leaves no one wondering where they are in their spiritual commitment.

3) Lukewarm - What would this church look like?

This state is not a transitional state, but rather became the permanent state of this church - when this happens, God's response is described. He vomits!

Apparently the lukewarm state is an obnoxious state to God. Better is the one who makes no profession than the one who has made a profession and yet demonstrates no outward life.

It is also interesting to note that Jesus does not condemn this church for any particular acts; they are lukewarm and this is a change that is sufficient to remove their candlestick.

Vs. 17 - Their problem - their attitude, their perception of themselves.

They are materially rich which cloaks their spiritual poverty. Spiritually they are...

1) wretched - our permanent moral condition rather than our actual transgressions - Rom.7:15-25; Ps.51:5; Eph.4:22.

2) miserable - Jms.4:9.

3) poor - lacking in spiritual goods - living in a state of poverty when spiritual wealth is available for the asking.

4) blind (2 Cor.4:4; those who live like mere men) - I Jn.2:9-11; Rom.2:17-29; 2 Pet.1:5-11.

5) naked - they have made no clothes - Rev.19:7-8.

Vs. 18 - Three things this church lacks —they need to obtain: gold, clothes, and eye salve.

 <u>gold</u> - material wealth, vs.17, has left this church in no better condition. Their belief that they are in need of nothing has missed the truth of their impoverished condition. They are exhorted to buy the gold that comes from Christ - I Pet.1:6-9; 2 Cor.4:16-18.

2) <u>clothes</u> - white garments - Rev.19:6-9; Eph.2:10 - again bought from Christ.
Only those that come from Him enter eternity. The shame of man's nakedness is his natural contribution.
The finest clothes produced by man <u>always</u> end up as filthy rags - Is.64:6. "All our righteous deeds are like a filthy garment".
They may look good to us (seem right) – Prov.14:12, "but it's end is the way of death".

3) eye salve - from Christ is needed. Both pastor and people of this church seem to have become blind to the things of God and they are not aware of their own blindness (I Jn.2:9-11).
 The church of the last days will become very much like Israel at the time of Christ - Mt.15:12, 14; II Pet.1:5-11; Rom.2:17-29.
 Does this passage not describe the church in America?

 Vs. 19 - The objects of God's love become the objects of His reproof and discipline - Heb.12:5-11. In context He is dealing with the church not individuals! Also note that being lukewarm places the church in the position of needing to be dealt with.

NOTE: "love" is from the word "phileo" not "agapao", a Greek term for affection with less depth - Why the choice of word? reprove - (rebuke) when the Lord does it, more than talk is involved. discipline - Hebrews 12 makes it clear that the fact that God does not give up the believer becomes a sign that we are owned by Him. Also, note I Cor.11:31-32 being lukewarm must be synonymous with sin! There is always an alternative to sin followed by judgment! It is repentance. Repentance results in a removal of the need to judge with temporal judgment by God. (again see II Pet.3:9-12).

Darby is quoted as saying,

"The immediate occasion, object, inner spring of all the terrible judgment which is coming is the professing church itself. It ought to have been God's witness on the earth... but, having become corrupt... brings down the wrath of God." Babylon the whore - false Christendom - will ride upon the government of antichrist and be destroyed by God before the tribulation ends -Rev.19:1-3.

Vs. 20 - This invitation is offered to the church and needs to be acted

upon by the members of it. No one is compelled to obedience.

No one is saved against his will. No group of believers must open their door of worship to Christ.

The only cure for being lukewarm is the re-admission of the excluded Christ. Christ remains on the outside unless He is welcomed in.

This is the church of the last days.

It will not remain forever - Lk.12:35-40.

The idea of dining with God reflects the ultimate relationship that exists with those we share a meal with.

Vs. 21 - He who overcomes

1) The Father's response to the Son - Phil.2:9-11; Heb.2:9-11 who overcame -Heb.5:7-10.

2) The Son's response to the believer who overcomes!

a) The church of this present age - Mt.19:27-30.

b) The tribulation saints - Rev.20:4.

This invitation is to the church that is "wretched and miserable and poor and blind and naked". The church age is God's age of grace! As long as breath is in us, grace is offered. Their will be no more grace offered once the breath is gone. Today is the day for the believer to repent.

Vs. 22 - He who has an ear, let him hear... Remember Rom.10:13-14.

REVELATION CHAPTER 4

Vs 1 Having concluded the "things which are", ch. 2 & 3 – after these things, we must now consider events which will take place after the church has been removed (raptured).
Chapters 4 & 5 are what the "raptured" John sees upon arriving in heaven, while ch. 6 & following describe that which takes place upon the earth.

NOTE: The church is not mentioned again by name in the book until Rev.22:16, and by description in Rev.19:7-9.

This would argue that the church is not involved in the events between these two passages.

Heaven – describes 3 different "places":

1) air above the earth – where birds fly

- dew comes from

- winds, rain, etc...

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2) stellar space – Deut.17:3
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3) The "abode of God" - a place, not a state of being: "third heaven" – 2 Cor.12:2.
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a) Jesus came down from heaven

Jn.6:38.

b) He taught us to pray "Our Father who art in heaven"

Mt.6:9.

c) Our reward comes to us in heaven

Mt.5:12.

d) Joy is experienced by those in heaven

Lk.15:7.

e) Angels are in heaven

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Mk.13:32.
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f) A "place" awaits the believer after death

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Jn.12:2-3.
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g) Jesus called it Paradise – Lk.23:43, so also Paul

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2 Cor.12:1-4.
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h) As the heavenly Jerusalem, it's appearance is described

Rev. 21 & 22. Note the tree of Life – Rev. 22:2; 2:7, with Lk. 23:43.

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i) Heb.12:22-24.
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The first voice I heard – Rev.1:12; 1:10

Come up here – I Thess.4:13-17

Verses 2 & 3 - The very first thing the Christian sees upon entering heaven is the throne of God.

Vs. 2 - 3 - Immediately John was transferred from this realm o the next. The first thing he sees is God upon His throne and that which strikes him first is the color he sees.

- 1) jasper stone crystal clear Rev.21:11 (diamond)
- 2) sardis red (ruby) the jasper and the sardis were the first and last stone on the high priest's breastplate (reverse order) Ex.28:15-21. The first stone represented Reuben, while the last, Benjamin. Both stones are used to describe the majesty of Lucifer as originally created – Ezk.28:13.
- 3) a rainbow around the throne.

NOTE: John's vision of the one sitting on the throne is not one of a "form", but rather an awareness of color. The glory of God appears to have been the intent of the vision.

Vs 4 The twenty four elders upon their own thrones Who do the elders represent?

1) It is a matter of Revelation that God's purpose in saving man

is that he might minister before Him as Priests, along with reigning with Him

Rev.20:6

2) The O.T. Priesthood was divided in to 24 divisions

l Chr.24:7-18.

(The musicians as well – I Chr.25:8-31).

Each division was headed by a man who represented it. When these priests met together, even though there were only twenty four, they represented the entire priesthood. In the same way these 24 in Revelation represent a body.

- 3) To further understand who they represent, they are said to be clothed in white garments
 - Rev.19:8,

and are wearing a "stephanos" (not a diadem) on their head Jms.1:12, I Pet.5:4, etc...

4) The Church has already been raptures at this point, while O.T. believers have not!

ls.26:19-21.

5) They cannot be angels either because angels have not yet been judged at this point I Cor.6:3 (Because their work is not yet finished as the church has been. In Rev.5:11, they are part of a heavenly group which includes angels which are said to be distinct from the angels.

 Vs 5 Lightening and thunder are experienced Rev.8:5; 11:19; Ex,19:16-17.
 Seven lamps of fire – the seven Spirits of God Is.11:2-3; Rev.1:4; 3:1. These seven lamps are the means by which John is informed of the presence of the Holy Spirit. (done Mt.3:16; tongues of fire Acts 2:1-4

speaking in non-learned languages Acts 2:7-8).

Vs. 6 – 9 A sea of glass like crystal – Ezk.1:22; Rev.22:1.

John appears to pass over the sea and is captivated by the four living creatures. 1) full of eyes – in front and behind – Ezk.1:18; 10:12. God sees

everything in His creation – never sleeps.

- 2) lion, calf, man, flying eagle Ezk.1:4-14.
- 3) six wings Is.6:2-3.
- 4) never ceasing to declare the holiness of God.
 - <u>Glory</u> very great praise or distinction bestowed by:
 - Common consent Admiration Adoring praise
 - <u>Honor</u> high respect, esteem Recognition of a high rank with distinction conferred.
 - Thanks a grateful feeling or acknowledgment as for a gift, favor,

service: gratitude, appreciation, acknowledgment.

- To Him who sits on the throne Rev.4:2; 5:1,6-7.
- Who lives forever and ever Rev.1:18.
- Vs. 10 11 The 24 elders (church) join the living creatures in worshipping He who sits upon the throne.
 They cast their crowns before the throne acknowledging that their rewards in heaven are also a gift from the God they are worshipping Eph.2:10.

When all is right in the universe – all glory, honor, and power are recognizes as coming from God and are the result of His created purpose Col.1:12-17; Rom.9:16, 18, 21-23; Eph.1:11; Rev.10:5-7.

REVELATION - CHAPTER 5

Vsı	God who is sitting on a throne, has a scroll sealed with 7 seals, (Roman law required a will to be sealed with 7 seals), in His right hand. This scroll of parchment is written on both sides and contains the prophecy of impending events which will be unfolded in the book of Revelation.	
Vs 2	A "strong angel" (mighty or powerful) There are 2 other "strong" angels mentioned in this book: Rev 10:1 and Rev 18:21 This angel proclaims as a herald Who is this angel? Gabriel? He is the angel sent by God to give Daniel understanding regarding his vision. Dan 8:15-17; 9:221-23 and was also involved in "concealing and sealing up until the end time", an understanding of that which is to take place. He may well be involved now in seeking for the unveiling of that which he had helped to seal.

Death

One fourth of the world population dies under the judgment.

(1.5 billion people if it happened today).

They die as a result of:

- 1. sword warfare
- 2. famine
- 3. pestilence
- 4. wild beasts

Vs 9-11The Fifth Seal

The scene shifts back to Heaven.

John sees a vision of those who will be martyred for their

These Four Angels have been granted permission to harm the earth and the sea.

The time referenced in this statement is the beginning of the Tribulation.

The destruction of Planet Earth is what lies ahead.

Another Angel ascends from the East to seal 144,000 Jews with the seal of the Living God.

The Seal symbolizes Divine protection and ownership and God's commitment to protect and preserve all 12 Tribes of Israel.

Vs 4-8 The 144,000 who are sealed.

The Twelve Tribes of Israel

- 1. Distinct Tribes in existence at the end of the
 - Tribulation. Rev 14:1-5; 21:1-3, 10-14
- 2.The one nation of Israel is defined as "the 12 Tribes of Israel"
- 3. Jacob, whose name was changed to Israel, adopted the

2 sons of Joseph, Gen 48:1-6 with Ephraim and Manasseh being added or replacing Joseph.

- a. Joseph receives a double portion of the inheritance.
- b. There are 13 tribes of Israel

The multitudes saved in the tribulation and subsequently martyred.

Vs. 9 – 10 - The multitude described

There are two categories of humans – Israelites, and Gentiles (Greeks). In verses 5 – 8, we were told that there are Jews saved out of all 12 tribes. In verse 9 a great multitude beyond human computation is seen coming from all nations, tribes, peoples and tongues.

1.) They are seen standing before the throne – Rev.4:1-11.

2.) Before the Lamb – Rev.5:6-14.

3.) Clothed in white robes – Rev.19:7-8 (in resurrection bodies) Rev.6:9-11 (pre resurrection bodies) followed by Rev.20:4.

The coming to life is equivalent to being raised from the dead receiving the resurrected body.

In chapter 6 and 7, they are quite alive awaiting their resurrection bodies – 2 Cor.5:1-9.

4.) Palm branches in their hands – Lev.23:40-44. (This was the "feast of booths" which commemorated God's provision for them in delivering them out of Egypt and through the wilderness.)

5.) They cry out – these are all martyrs: they have suffered to the point of death – Heb.12:1-4, yet they do not lose sight of who suffered to give them their salvation.

Application – If credit were to be shared between humans and God for salvation, these could claim some credit – they don't! Who is there who has suffered for less who thinks that they deserve recognition – all recognition goes to God who sits on the throne and to the Lamb Eph.1:3-6 (Father), 7 (Son), 8-12 (Father).

Vs. 11 – 12 The heavenly host joins in with the martyred tribulation saints.

They, the angels – Rev.5:11 (2/3 of the number created – Rev.12:3 -4,9) acknowledge our God as their God forever and ever. Similar to Rev.5:13-14, the angels ascribe to God:

- 1.) blessing
- 2.) glory
- 3.) wisdom
- 4.) thanksgiving
- 5.) honor
- 6.) power
- 7.) might

In Rev. 5, it is Christ who is the focus, in chapter 7, it is God. Remember that it is the Father's desire that all honor the Son even as they honor the Father – John 5:23, and when all honor the Son, He will honor the Father – I Cor.15:28.

- Vs. 13 14 The martyred dead are identified the ones who come out of the great tribulation (2nd half) – Matt.24:21. The command in Matt.24:14 and 28:19-20 will have its ultimate fulfillment.
- NOTE: The importance of the blood.

Acts 20:28 – The church of God which He purchased with "His own blood" .

Rom. 5:9 – "justified by His blood".

Rom.3:25 – Christ is the propitiation (satisfaction) for our sins through faith in His blood.

Eph.1:7 – "we have redemption through His blood"

Col.1:20 – "made peace through the blood of His cross"

Heb.9:22

Saving faith is focused on the shed blood of Jesus Christ. It never "progresses: from that focus.

It is now over – no more:

THE SEVENTH SEAL – SEVEN TRUMPET JUDGMENTS

Vs 1 Picks up chronologically with chapter 6 The 7th Seal contains all the subsequent developments Which lead up to the Return of Christ. (The 7th Trumpet Judgment contains the 7 Bowl Judgments.) There is "dead silence" in Heaven for half an hour; the silence which can be felt before the jury foreman reports the verdict. Vs 2 An introduction to the 7 Angels (God uses Angels to carry out His plans in a similar manner to the way He uses humans. Heb 1:14; Rom 10:13-15; Rom 7:7 The Law is spoken of as "an active entity" doing the work of God by itself. In fact, it was delivered by both Man (Moses), and angels yet once delivered, works the work of God. Luke 1:19 The fact that these angels stand before God indicates Their place of prominence within God's creation. Trumpets and their use are prominent in the Scriptures 1. At the giving of the Law Ex 19:17-19 2. To announce special days Liv 23:23-25; 25:9 3. To announce the movement of the people Num 10:2-10 4. The OT tells us it was to be used to announce the coming Tribulation Period. REVELATION CHAPTER 9

The Fifth and Sixth Trumpets: The First and Second Woes

- Vs 1 In Rev 6:12-13 and Rev 8:12 refer to literal heavenly bodies
 - The star of 9:1 is a person:
 - A more accurate translation found in many of the transcripts reads "a fallen star". The word "fall" is in the perfect tense, signifying completed action.
 - Isa 14:12; Lk 10:18 refers to Lucifer, "a star", who fell. Rev 12 describes the "fallen star" along with a third of the other stars being cast out of Heaven. Job 38:7
 - 2. As to the timing of the "being cast out" The event has already taken place (past tense), when the keys are given to the person.

The one who has the keys – Rev 1:18 – gives this key to Satan.

There is nothing outside the direct control of God (Jesus).

The bottomless Pit (Abyss)

1. Lk 8:31 demons are (can be) sent there as a form of punishment. Jude 6

with Gen 6:1-7

2. Christ went there after His crucifixion. Rom 10:7 (One does not need to

ascend to Heaven or descend to the abyss to find righteousness. Christ offers that righteousness – by faith).

l Pet 3:18-20

- 3. Satan, who is given the keys during the tribulation, to open the pit up, will, at the end of the tribulation, be confined to it for 1,000 years. Rev 20:1-3
- 4. The abyss is found 7 times in the Book of Revelation:

9:1,2,11; 11:7; 17:8; 20:1,3

- Vs 2 Records the use of the key The abyss "erupts", polluting the world with spiritual corruption. The Fifth Trumpet can be characterized as demonic and Satanic oppression.
- Vs 3-6 Locusts are set free upon mankind

- Even as a demonic hoard they receive their "limits" from God. They may do this...but not kill.
- 2. They are commanded to hurt those who do not have the "Seal of

God".

These would be the 144,000, Rev 7:2-8 and probably those humans who have believed at this point. 2 Tim 2:19; Eph 1:13-14

3. Locusts are used in prior judgments.

Ex 10:12-20; Joel 1:4-7 These locusts are obviously different, being demonic creatures, reserved for this day. They were not created to be evil, Gen 1:31, but became as such at a time following the Creation.

4. Their sting is compared to that of a scorpion.

The pain caused by their sting lasts 5 months. It is so awful that men will seek death to escape it.

4. Note that the prior plagues which involved natural things have now been

expanded to include demonic activity.

5. Why would it be that a person who desires to kill themselves would not be

able to do it? We find in the gospels that demonic control results in the person losing their own will and acting out the will of the demon(s). (Satan partners with no human!)

- Vs 7-11 The locusts described:
 - These "spiritual" beings are called locusts because they function as a judgment and plague of the Lord. Spiritual beings do not possess a physical body. Their description is intended to symbolize their Characteristics.
 - a. They are the size of horses, prepared for battle
 - b. Crowns of gold:

<u>They</u> reign upon the earth, not man; their will shall be done.

d. faces of men, hair of women, and teeth of lions: frightening instruments of Divine judgment Man has a history of joining himself to demonic beings, thinking that they will be his servants.

Man is deluded. They are destroyers. When

REVELATION – CHAPTER 11

Vs 1-2 The Measuring

- b. The Temple of the Future Kingdom Ezk 40
- c. The New Jerusalem
 - Rev 21:15-17
- The act of measuring seems to signify that what is being

measured,

belongs to God. It is an evaluation of His property.

2. The Jewish nation was given the Holy of Holies as the place where God

would meet with them.

Ex 26:31-34; Lev 16

During the tribulation it will be desecrated and becomes the home of an idol of the world ruler.

- Vs 7 When they have finished their testimony, God will allow them to be killed. No one will lose their life before God's time – Eph 1:11b, and God has appointed a time for many of His children to die "untimely deaths". Jn 21:21-22; Rev 13:7

From the world's perspective, God's message of judgment has died with its messenger. Kill the messenger and the message won't stand!

REVELATION CHAPTER 13

The Beast and the False Prophet

Vs 1-2 The Beast who comes up out of the sea

This passage involves both a <u>Revived Roman Empire</u> which rises to worldwide dominion and an evil individual who

takes over the leadership of that world power,

exercising total satanic power in carrying out his leadership.

Rev 17:8-13

Some versions put the first statement of Rev 13:1 as part of the last verse in chapter 12.

Wherever placed, we find the dragon (Satan) standing on the shoreline of the sea, which represents his one-world empire – 1 Jn 5:19; Rev 11:15, awaiting the emergence of his "son" who will carry out his (devil's) heart's desire.

NOTE: Problem with the translation: Some manuscripts read "I stood", while others read, "He stood":

1. John stood on the seashore (more probable reading) --- OR---

2. The beast stood on the seashore

There is no significant difference in the two.

(Some of your Bibles will say the one, while the rest will say the other.)

<u>Verse one</u> describes the Revived Roman Empire, which will be established before the beast takes control of it. Verse two is a description of the ultimate leader of this empire: anti-christ.

Dan 7:7-8,19-25 makes this same distinction.

In Rev 12:3, the dragon who is behind the human leader is presented as the real force.

In Rev 17:3,7 this world-system's connection with false Christianity is described.

In Rev 13, the world ruler has already taken control of this final phase of Satan's kingdom.

Ten horns wearing ten diadems, seven heads with

blasphemous names, combining the most significant characteristics of the previous forms of the world government.

 leopard – Alexandrian Empire: swift It's world-wide consolidation

will take less than a life-time.

2. bear – Medo-Persian: strength and tenacity

 3. lion – Babylon: majesty and power
 4. Satan has been freed by God to finish that which God created him to do.

NOTE: When described in Rev 17:10-12, there appears to be both a consecutive progression of these rulers and a simultaneous reigning of them.

This difference might be resolved by regarding the heads as successive, referring to kings or emperors, and the horns as kings who will reign simultaneously, receiving their power from the beast (empire, not individual), in both its historic and prophetic characters.

Vs 3 Again Two Possibilities: One of his heads....healed

1. If the head comes out of the consecutive progression, then the Roman

Empire which appears to have died will come back to life in all its glory, amazing the world and causing them to come under its influence.

(Much the way the USA has developed, even more so.... if the EU continues and consolidates, it could ultimately Become the fulfillment!)

2. If the last world ruler – anti-christ – is meant, then he will recover from a

deadly wound which will magnify him as "the" world ruler of choice.

In either case, the revival of the future empire and its final ruler is a miracle and a demonstration of the power of Satan.

Vs 4 The final form of apostasy – 2 Thes 2:3 – is not simply the worship of an idol but the worship of Satan himself. The beast is Satan's substitute for Christ. Phil3:3

> NOTE what impresses the world about the beast! Who is able to "wage war with him"?!

Love, humility, etc. are not characteristics which impress the world; power is!

The world situation that requires a world leader, coupled with his ability to rule it, helps make him an awesome human from the world's perspective.

He next tells the world to make an image of the beast. Dan 3:1ff

This image is referred to 7 more times in the Book of Revelation. 14:9, 11; 15:2; 16:2; 19:20; 20:4

The image becomes the capstone of idolatry in Satan's kingdom.

Vs 15-17 The false prophet causes the image to "breath and speak". Demonic possession results in a person speaking with the demon's voice.

What the false prophet does is not as important as the response of the world to what it sees done.

The means to buy and sell now comes into play. The false prophet causes all who would survive to receive the mark of the antichrist.

It appears that receiving the mark signifies that the person has Worshipped the image. If you worship, you receive the mark. If you don't worship, you die.

The mark of the beast, his name or his number, serves as a Necessary identification to conduct business and to purchase the Necessities of life.

Thought of another way it becomes another device to Force all people to worship the beast.

Vs 18 The number of the beast – 666

QUESTION: Is there any indication that either the anti-christ or the false prophet are Jewish.

REVELATION CHAPTER 14

Verses 1 – 5 The Lamb and the 144,000 on Mount Zion

The wine press is outside the city of Jerusalem and the blood flow rises to the height of a horse's bridle for a 200 mile radius!

Chapters 15 and 16 conclude the chronological ordered events leading up to the Second Coming of Christ.

The Seven Bowl Judgments ARE the Seventh Trumpet Judgment.

Vs 1 John sees "another sign in Heaven".

This follows two prior signs. Rev 12:1,3

- 1. Rev 12:1 Israel, the women
- 2. Rev 12:3 final World empire, headed by the beast
- 3. Rev 15:1 The final judgment upon the Satanic system and its ruler

John describes what he sees as "great and marvelous": Angels in groups of seven have been seen before. This must be a separate group because no article is used. One of these angels is seen after the judgments are completed. Rev 21:9

In the original it is stated that these angels "having seven plagues, the last ones" are about to pour them out. It also makes clear that the previous judgments were also plagues. Rev 9:18,20 11:6; 16:9; 18:8; 22:18

"In them the wrath of God is finished – wrath is not an attitude, but the expression of divine judgment." Rev 16:19

Vs 2 Those who had been victorious over....(died Rev 13:7 had defeated the dragon by denying him his desire) standing before a sea of glass mixed with fire. Rev 4:6

> Their ultimate reward is described in Rev 20:4-6, holding Harps of God – not all receive harps Rev 7:9-17.

> Both have come out of the tribulation, but rewards vary! (Not all people die under the same circumstances during the tribulation.)

Vs 3-4 The "Song of Moses" Ex 15:1-18 or Deut 32:1-43 Both songs picture God's faithfulness to Israel and the defeat of her enemies.

Great and marvelous are Your works – both up to the present and extending into Eternity.

Righteous and true is Your Person. He is both righteous in providing salvation Rom 3:21-26, and in judging every man that does not receive Christ's provision for them. 2 Cor 5:18-19

Christ is "King of the nations" and will be recognized as such By every created being. Phil 2:5-11 (Ps 2:8-9; 24:1-10; 66:1-4; 72:8-11; 88:9; Isa 2:2-4; 9:6-7; 66:18-23; Dan 7:14; Zech 14:9)

Vs 5-6 The Holy of Holies in the Heavenly Tabernacle is opened.

"Tabernacle of Testimony" refers to the entire tabernacle, which contained the Ark, which held the ten commandments. Ex 38:21; Num 1:50-54; 10:11, etc

What John sees is the curtain parting and seven angels coming out Of the Holy of Holies in Heaven.

Note: On earth only the high priest entered on the Day of

Atonement, after sacrificing for his own sins, Lev 16. The angels, who have no sin, apparently experience complete access to the temple in heaven.

As to the linen they are dressed in – see our prior notes. Their golden sashes may be the same as Christ is seen wearing in Rev 1:13.

Since angels do not possess imputed righteousness – Heb 2:14-16, the connection between the two passages is uncertain. No real explanation is found in the Bible.

Vs 7-8 In verse 6 the angels are differentiated by the fact that they are the angels who had the seven plagues.

In verse 7 we are told how they received them.

The word "wrath" is the word "anger". God's anger is satisfied from a temporal view here.

From an eternal view, it is never satisfied – Rev 14:10 – for

those who did not accept the means to satisfy His anger.

Rom 3:25

Once this final set of judgments is begun, no created being is able to enter the Temple (Holy of Holies) until they are completed. Ex 40:34-38

Note: Just as God lives forever and ever so does the judgment of the lost.

When the Creator was mocked, beaten, and spat upon, He did not defend Himself or hurt His enemies. Not so with His children.

In verse 7 some manuscripts add "another out of", which is probably reflective of the meaning of what is being said. The utterance would come from a Being, rather than from the altar itself.

Vs 8-9 The Fourth Bowl — parallels the Fourth Trumpet — Rev 8:12 Again, one third versus universal judgment... With this Bowl Judgment the sun increases its intensity and burns mankind with its heat.

> The Tribulation is almost over and the reality of God is obvious, yet, lost man's response to God is to blaspheme Him. Spiritually dead men do not repent.

Vs 10-11 The Fifth Bowl – judgment directed at the Beast, and his subjects
The throne of the beast focuses on the authority which the beast has taken up.
The wicked in their suffering are said to gnaw their tongues for pain. Still no repentance.
This is the last reference to their failure to repent.
Rev 2:21; 9:20-21; 16:9

- Vs 12-16 The Sixth Bowl the drying up of the great river Euphrates, in preparation for the conclusion of Armageddon
- Vs 12 The river Euphrates formed the Eastern boundary of the ancient Roman Empire. It is also the Eastern boundary of the land which God promised to the seed of Abraham. Gen 15:18; Deut 1:7; 11:24; Joshua 1:4 The kings of the East are the rulers of the Orient who will descend upon the Middle East for the Final World Battle.
- Vs 13-14 John experiences an additional vision which is a commentary on the Sixth Bowl. He sees three demons who appear as frogs coming out of the mouths of the satanic trinity. The demon indwelling the false prophet is probably the power behind the miracles worked by the false prophet. Rev 13:12-15 These demons are involved in the gathering of the forces of the

THE DESTRUCTION OF RELIGIOUS BABYLON

Religious (Ch 17) and Commercial (Ch 18) Babylon represent such a significant entity that they each warrant a chapter in the book of Revelation. Satan, in the person of anti-christ, is not the only "force" that matters.

These two world systems precede his entrance and are the human's input and control of the fallen world order. (Satan didn't make us do it; we did it because we are depraved.)

Religious Babylon is destroyed prior to the end of the Great Tribulation. Rev 19:1-3 states that she has been destroyed, yet Rev 19:11-16, which describes the Return of Christ, has not yet happened.

It would make sense that her destruction would be brought about shortly after the Great Tribulation begins, because anti-christ sets himself up as the object of worship precluding all others.

Chapter 17 is broken down into two parts: Verses 1-7 describe the Vision, while Verses 8-18 give the meaning of the Vision.

THE VISION – vs 1-7

Vsı	One of the Bowl Angels gives John the tour <u>Note:</u> It has been asked if the angels know the plan of God, prior To its unfolding. This angel both knows the Vision and is the one who explains its fulfillment.

In chapter 18 the vision shifts to the political entity. It must be remembered that both the religious and the political entity work as a unit.

Sits on many waters – again vs 15

Vs 2 Two spiritual concepts which sum up her prostitution: "The people of the earth were made drunk (become controlled by Eph 5:18) with the wine of her immorality which she fed them", and "the kings of the earth committed acts of immorality with her."

> <u>NOTE:</u> Spiritual adultery is not ordinarily used of heathen nations who do not know God, but of people who outwardly carry the name of God while actually worshipping and serving other gods. Israel is often described in this condition in the OT Ezk 16 and 23; all of Hosea.

In the NT Christians are warned to avoid this type of adultery. Jas 4:4

This body or organization has developed prior to the beginning of the Tribulation period. She is fully functional from the first day. If she carries the name of Christ and yet was not raptured, then this body is made up of professing Christianity from our age. Her organizational structure will also precede the tribulation period. We will see if the further information provided in the chapter will help us determine who this organization might be.

Vs 3-4 The Vision of the Woman on the Beast

John receives an invitation from the angel, vs 1, which he accepts, vs 3.

He is carried into wilderness (no article) in a "spiritual state". (If he entered a state of "in the Spirit" Rev 1:10, and has continued in that state from the time the revelation began, then it would appear he has been transferred to a "new section" and is continuing in that state.)

In this transferred place he saw a woman (same one described in vs 1 & 2) sitting on a scarlet beast; the beast having seven heads and ten horns, covered with blasphemous names.

1. The fact that she is riding the beast means that she is not the beast

2. Her position, that of riding the beast

Vs 3

a. indicates she is supported by the beast

b. and that she is in a dominant role and at least outwardly she , to some extent, controls or directs the beast

 "Church and state" are merged. Religious Babylon is supported by political Babylon and, in fact, has some influence over political Babylon.
 The woman has such a close association with the beast that it is clear how apostate the organized Christian church becomes at the time of the end.

5. The only worldwide church recognized in the Bible is this apostate church. It is the remnant (majority) that is left behind when the rapture occurs.

6. The description of the beast as having seven heads and ten horns will be explained shortly. Vs 9-13

Vs 4 The woman is clothed in....The present-day ecclesiastical Churches (Catholic, Russian, and Greek orthodox, etc.), decked in such garb! No church in John's day represented such wealth. The church present today does. (John would never have guessed the transformation if God had not revealed it to him.)

The golden cup held in her hand stands for the height of abomination committed by her.

The re-working of the "finished work of Christ" so that it never finishes would be a good candidate for the interpretation.

Vs 5 The name of the woman 1. Mystery – a descriptive reference to the title, not a part of the title itself. This is the mystery religion that began in Nimrod's time and has circled the Globe, coming to its fullness at the time of the Tribulation.

>Anti-christ's kingdom

NOTE: Daniel's visions involved 5 kings which were current or yet future to Daniel. The first two had already seen their day.

Remember that these "mountains" are the empires that affected Israel and are not in contradiction with the other empires of world history.

It is the one yet to come that is the object of this revelation. Anti-christ is the focus. The final empire will be in existence when the Tribulation begins. It will have a leader or ruling tribunal (3 horns). Anti-christ, the eighth king will rise up over the 3 horns; tear them out and replace them. He is the eighth. As to being one of the seven, he will reign with them before he makes his move and reigns over them.

THE ANTI-CHRIST GOES TO DESTRUCTION - Rev 19:20

Vs 12-15	 The ten horns are ten kings joined in a confederacy which forms the final Gentile world empire. Unlike the seven previous kings who rule consecutively, these reign as one. They begin by reigning with the anti-christ. 1. These 10 have the same purpose (heart) as the anti-christ. Their united vision will include the extermination of the Jews. 2. Vs 18 The woman – false Christianity the final form which Nimrod began will be headed by the great city. There will be a united world "Christian" church operating during the first half of the tribulation. This apostolic church will be headed by a religious center – ROME???

The church centered in this city will finally reign over the kings of the earth

Verses 1-3 THE ANNOUNCEMENT OF THE FALL OF BABYLON

Vs 1 "After these things" means that the action recorded in chapter 18 takes place at a later time than the action reported in chapter 17.

Again, religious Babylon falls at the mid-point of the Tribulation while Babylon the world's political and commercial system survives until the end of the Tribulation.

"Another angel" – in context, an angel different than the one seen in chapter 17:1.

>Being described as "another" means that this is an angel and not Christ in a different form.

>His great authority and power and the fact that the entire earth is illuminated with His glory would indicate that he is an angel of the greatest order and is about to carry out a great work on behalf of God!

Vs 2 "Fallen" is repeated; and the tense of the verb indicates that the action is completed, though the context indicates the event is yet future.

Religious Babylon's destruction is already past. Rev 17:16

- 1. Completed action when describing a yet future event sometimes is used to stress the certainty of that which is being described.
- The first "fallen" might be in reference to the fall of Religious Babylon at the halfway mark, while the second "fallen" is referencing the secular fall. Many times throughout the book, both Babylons are described as functioning together. Rev 17:1-3,9

"She" is not referring to Religious Babylon, but rather to "the kingdom of the world" (singular). Rev 11:15 This kingdom had Nebuchadnezzar's empire as its head and has been progressively worse as time has passed. It's ultimate functioning will be seen when Satan reigns over it personally and demonic spirits permeate it. Rev 9:1-11

(Remember that the different phases of this world's kingdom do not stand alone, but rather, build upon the prior phases.)

In verses 5-7 a Great Multitude of His bondservants begin their own "Hallelujah Chorus" because the "Marriage of the Lamb" has come.

In verse 9 – then he Rev 14:13; 19:5 (also note Rev 21:5)

-told John, to

write that those who are invited to the Marriage Supper are truly blessed.

 Are all invited to the supper who were part of the marriage?

	2. Is the bride partial at the supper?
	3. Are there "attendants" at the supper who are separate from the bride? Matt25:1-13 (further clarification: Matt 25:14-30) the bride being the church, and the attendants at the wedding being believers of other ages.
	Note: God does not treat all believers of all ages exactly alike. The Divine purpose is not the same for Israel, Gentile Believers outside the church age, the Church of the present age, or even the elect angels! This same truth also applies to the individuals who make up the individual bodies. In all these relationships, God is completely sovereign, righteous, and wise.
	This is the Fourth Beatitude of the Book of Revelation. These beatitudes are "true words of God". (1 Tim 1:15; 3:1; 4:9; 2 Tim 2:11; Titus 3:8– "Trustworthy Statements"

The Binding of Satan – verses 1-3

Vs 1 John sees another angel, (Rev 7:2; 8:3; 10:1; 14:6,8,9,15,17,18; 17:1; 18:1; 19:17) operating at the command and in the authority of God.

> This angel possesses the key to the abyss (bottomless pit). (Rev 9:1,2,11; Lk 8:26-33 esp. vs 31; Rev 10:5-8)

- Vs 2-3 The angel is empowered to perform 5 functions:
 - 1. to lay hold of the dragon Rev 12:3-4 (the serpent of old Gen 3:1-7; devil, Satan)

2. bind him for a thousand years (with the great chain, vs 1) NOTE
a. Is this the language of appearance? How is a spiritual being bound by a chain?

- b. The word translated "chain" is found in: Mk 5:3; Acts 12:7; 28:20; 2 Tim 1:16
- c. Spiritual chains different words are also found elseware in the Bible. 2 Pet 2:4 with Jude 6
- d. Picture Satan is not merely restricted, but he is rendered completely inactive.
- e. Would not the thousand years referenced in verse 2 be as literal as the same thousand years referenced in vs 6?
- f. Consider the quantity of life when Satan is loose Tribulation period and Gog and Magog with life when he is bound – Millennial Kingdom.
- 3. Throw him into the abyss.
- 4. Shut and seal the abyss he is out of the picture.
- 5. Possibly release him after the Millennium. Rev 20:7

The Resurrection and Judgment of the Tribulation Believers – vs 4-6

Vs 5-6 The statement of the completion of the "First Resurrection"

VI. RESURRECTIONS

A. All people everywhere from all time will be resurrected **1** Cor **15:21-28,35-49; 2** Cor **5: 1-9!!**

Resurrection is not the same as restoration. In more than 40 New Testament references to resurrection, with the possible exception of **Lk 2:34**, it always refers to a literal resurrection, never in a spiritual or nonliteral sense, and has to do with the raising up of the physical body.

Dan 12:1-3; Jn 5:25-29; 1 Cor 15:12-58; lsa 26:19-21

- B. There are two kinds of resurrection in God's program:
- 1. The Resurrection <u>UNTO LIFE (First Resurrection)</u> Lk 14:13-14 Phil 3:8-11

The time order or sequence of the first resurrection is given as follows: **1 Cor 15:23**

- a. Christ Matt 28:1-7; Heb 6:19-20; Jn 5:22; Heb 2:14-18
- b. A handful of Old Testament believers Matt 27:50-53
- c. The church prior to the tribulation **1 Thes 4:13-18; 1 Cor 15:51-58**

d. Believing Israel at the end of the tribulation (all O.T. believers) Job 14:13-15; Dan 12:9-13; Ezk 37:1-14 (May represent the Nation of Israel in 1948); Isa 26:19-21 2. The Resurrection <u>UNTO DAMNATION - GREAT WHITE THRONE</u> JUDGEMENT Rev 20:5-15

NOTE: This passage clearly teaches that there is a 1000 year gap between the First and the Second Resurrection. Other passages such as Dan 12:2 and Jn 5:28-29 refer to the truth that both the righteous and the wicked will be resurrected rather than the timing of those resurrections.

The "loosing" of Satan and the Final Revolt – vs 7-9 This final rebellion can only be appreciated when the context in which it occurs is remembered. For 1000 years man's experience can be summarized as follows: 1. Jerusalem will be the capital of the earth.

- 2. Peace will be the universal experience. Isa 11
- 3. There will be justice for all.
- 4. The wicked will be dealt with.
- 5. The animal kingdom will become tame.
- Revelation chapter 20 continued
- 6. The earth shall be full of the knowledge of the Lord.
- 7. All nations will serve Him.
- 8. The earth will be filled with the glory of the Lord.
- 9. No Satanic oppression or evil
- 10. For the period of 1000 years, the earth will experience the presence of God and His perfect, divine government.
- 11. Israel will be exalted and Gentiles will be blessed.
- 12. God's purpose for creating the Garden of Eden will be realized.

13. At the beginning of the reign all rebels will be purged out. Ezk 20:34-38

At the conclusion of the above experience, organized opportunity to express open rejection of God will become available.

The descendants of those who enter the kingdom age will make up this vast body of rebellious people.

This final battle is referred to as being spearheaded by Gog and Magog. These two powers are mentioned in Ezk 38 and 39. They appear to refer to two unrelated events which are separated by more than 1000 years.

Consider the following observations GOG and MAGOG a. That which occurs after the Millennium Rev 20:7-9 b. That which occurs prior to the Millennium Ezk 38-39 1a. Satan is prominent 1b. Satan is not mentioned 2a. Participants will come from the four corners of the earth. 2b. Participants will come from the north of Israel. Ezk 38:6,15; 39:2 3a. The number of soldiers will be beyond count. 3b. Many nations will be represented in the battle. Ezk 38:5, 22 4a. Heaven and earth will disappear Rev 20:11 4b. There will be at least 7 months following the battle. Ezk 39:9-16 5a. The GWT, which necessitates the resurrection of all the lost, follows immediately after the battle. Rev 20:11-15 Also the dead are said to be burned up! 5b. Why bury the dead over a seven month period, Ezk 39:12-13, if they are going to be immediately raised from the dead when they are?

6a. No time remains after.

6b. Seven years remain after.

Ezk 39:9-10

7a. Israel was drawn to God 1000 years prior to the stated event. Rom 11:26-27

7b. In Ezekiel, the battle is a catalyst which God will use to draw Israel to Himself. Ezk 39:7, 22-29

As seen above, the events after each battle are so different that two separate battles must be being spoken of!

In Revelation 20, we have very little information provided relating to that battle.

In Ezekiel 38 and 39, we have a great deal more information provided: 1. The invading armies – chapter 38

2. The setting

- > The invasion takes place at a time when Israel occupies the Land. Ezk 38:8
 This re-gathering is described in Ezk 37:1-14.
 It is a time in Israel's life when she will be back in the Land, yet be unsaved. (1948 – 2nd Advent).
- > The anti-christ will be the leading force in the Revived Roman Empire and will provide Israel with a commitment to allow her to stay in the Land, setting the Arab-Israel confrontation concerning her right to be in the Land. Dan 9:27 Isa 28:18 refers to the covenant as a "covenant of death"

and a "pact with Hell". At its beginning, Israel will experience a time of peace. Ezk 38:11

3. Ezekiel further states that this invasion will occur in:

a. the latter years Ezk 38:8 – time prior to the last days Deut 4:27-30; Dan 2:28; 8:23; 10:14

b. the last days Ezk 38:16 is related to the time of Israel's salvation or Millennial age. Isa 2:2-4; Micah 4:1-7

Will the battle take place before the Tribulation or in the First Half of the Tribulation?

Dwight Pentecost of Dallas Seminary offers the following as to how he sees the battle of Gog and Magog of Ezekiel 38 & 39 taking place:

1. Israel makes a covenant with the beast and occupies her land in a false security.

Dan 9:27; Ezk 38:8,11

- Because of a desire for spoil at the expense of an easy prey, the king of the north, satanically motivated, invades Palestine.
 Ezk 38:11; Joel 2:1-21; Isa 10:12; 30:31-33; 31:8-9
- 3. The beast breaks his covenant with Israel and moves into the Land. Dan 11:41-45
- 4. The king of the north is destroyed on the mountains of Israel. Ezk 39:1-4
- 5. The Land of Palestine is occupied by the armies of the beast. Dan 11:45
- 6. At this time the great coalition of nations takes place that forms one government under the beast.
 Ps 2:1-3; Rev 13:7
- 7. The kings of the east are brought in against the armies of the beast (Rev 16:12) as a result of the desolution of the government of Gog.
- 8. When the nations of the earth are gathered together around Jerusalem, Zech 4:1-3 and the Valley of Jehosaphat Joel 3:2, the Lord returns

to destroy all Gentile world powers so that He might rule the nations Himself.

This is further described in:

Zech 12:1-9; 14:1-4 Isa 33:1 – 34:17; 63:1-6; 66:15-16; Jer 25:27-33; Rev 20:7-10 (taken from Bib Sac 114:456 (Oct 57) p 347)

- Vs 10 The doom of Satan
 - The deceiver who was first deceived himself when he launched his career to be like God Isa 14:14, and then deceived Eve in the Garden.
 - 2. Satan joins the beast and the false prophet who have been in this fire for 1000 years.
 The Word of God clearly declares that death is not annihilation and that the wicked exist forever in torment. (See my notes on Hell.)
- Vs 11 The Great White Throne Our first view of "a throne" is found in Rev 4:2. It is mentioned more than 30 times in this book. This throne is probably different and Jesus Christ is probably the One sitting upon it. Jn 5:22; Matt 19:28; 25:31; 2 Cor 5:10

The majesty of the One sitting on the throne causes the present Heaven and earth to flee away.

(In Rev 21:1, John sees a New Heaven and a New Earth replace the first.)

The end of this present world is found in many places in the Bible: Matt 24:35; Mk 13:31; Lk 16:17; 21:33; 2 Pet 3:10

Vs 12-13 The Resurrection of the Lost These are those passed over at the times of the First Resurrection. Those raised will come from all walks of life and degrees of greatness. Their time has come Heb 9:27. There is also a judgment of works – their last conviction, no propitiation appropriated by them, and hard work on their part to earn their level in the Lake, all become factors in their eternal destiny. Overview of the scriptural revelation of God declaring the importance of works in eternity.

As to death and Hades giving up the dead which are in them – see "Where do we go when we die".

Vs 14-15 The Lake of Fire All who died physically and were in Hades, the intermediate state, are now cast into the Lake of fire.

The fact that their name was not found in the Book of Life is what sets their destiny in the Lake.

God's means of being propitiated was not appropriated by these individuals.

This, and this alone, is what determines whether an individual ends up in Heaven or Hell; all others are secondary.

Vs 1 I saw (vs 2 & vs 22) A new Heaven and a new Earth Isa 65:17; 66:22; 2 Pet 3:13

> The old have disappeared. No sea on it; possibly only a river flowing from the Throne of God. Rev 22:2

The Millennial Earth will have bodies of water upon it. Ps 72:8-11 (the Millennial reign) Isa 11:9, 11; Ezk 47:10, 15, 17, 18, 20 etc John is apparently struck by the fact that no seas exist on the New Earth.

Vs 2 New Jerusalem, the Holy City, in contrast to Rev 11:8, comes down out of Heaven.
It was not just created; it had existed prior to this time and God sends it down.
Heb 12:22-24; Jn 14:2
A city having the freshness and beauty of a bride adorned for marriage, for her husband.

- Vs 3 That which has been promised has become reality! The Tabernacle of God is with men. Rev 13: 6 The Tabernacle of God has moved to the New earth. What does this mean? 1. God will dwell among men
 - 2. They shall be His people
 - 3. God Himself will be among them.

Vs 4 He will wipe away every tear (singular)

- 1. The comfort of God, not the remorse of His children is the focus.
- 2. The tears refer to tears shed on earth, as believers endured suffering, rather than tears shed in Heaven because of human failure.
- 3. In the same vein, no more sorrow as a result of death, crying or pain.

	4. Not only will the old heaven and earth pass away but also all " The Fall" associations that belonged to them.
Vs 5	He who sits upon the Throne says "I am making all things new". John is again told to write

Vs 9-11The New Jerusalem as the bride

As in Rev 21:2, the comparison of the city with a bride stresses its beauty and its close relation to Jesus.

John is shown the Heavenly city of Jerusalem in much the same

way that Moses was shown the Promised Land. Deut 34:1-3 Again as in Rev 21:2: Holy city coming down out of heavens from God The city reflected the light of God and at the same time was crystal clear.

Vs 12-14 The wall and the gates of the city Wall 1. great and high

The Gates

- 1. 12 in number (city is square) 3 gates per side
- 2. guarded by 12 angels
- 3. inscribed with the names of the 12 tribes of Israel Ezk 48:30-34
- 4. built upon 12 foundation stones, each one inscribed with an `Apostle's name.
- NOTE: By mentioning both the Apostles and the Tribes of Israel in relation to Eternity future, God never replaces Israel with the Church! They remain distinct bodies, along with the Gentiles, Rev 21:24 throughout Eternity.

Further information concerning both the walls and the gates will be given in verses 18-21

Vs 15-17 The Dimensions of the City
Using a rod, a measure is about 10 feet long.
The City is square.
A furlong (KJV) is equal to 582 feet, the measured distance is equivalent to 1,342 miles – often stated as 1500 miles.
Thus, the city is 1,342 miles square.
The angel also measures the wall as being 216 feet high.
Angels and humans would measure it the same!

- Vs 18-21 Further descriptions.
 - 1. The walls are jasper.
 - 2. The city as a whole, is pure gold though like clear glass in appearance.
 - 3. The foundation stones are covered with precious stones
 - 4. Each of the 12 gates is a single pearl
 - 5. The street of the city was transparent gold
- Vs 22 The Temple of the City There is none. No longer is there any need for a structure for man to be aware of the presence of God, God Himself is present.
- Vs 23-24 The Light of the City No need of a light source – God is there! All of the city is transparent because God's light reflects throughout it. Believing Gentiles, prior and post church age, will populate the Eternal kingdom. God has included a remnant from all! All three categories of humanity will continue separately. As we saw in our study of Daniel, Nebuchadnezzar never became Hebrew, but he may well have become a believer.
- Vs 25-27 Access to the City Again, God has made everything for its own purpose and the Gentiles are one of those creations.

Vs 27 stresses the fact that nothing will affect the new creation as Satan afflicted the old.

- Vs 1 The River of the Water of Life If chapter 22 is referring to the Eternal state and not the Millennium, then that which is described is similar to Ezk 47:1-12 and Zech 14:8 (which is the Millennial Sea) but not the same. The dual Throne of God must reflect 1 Cor 15:28.
- Vs 2 The River of Life is said to flow down the middle of the street (singular) Rev 21:21 – street (singular) with the branches of the Tree of Life overhanging both sides of the River, having been planted in the Middle of the River.

Some believe there will be trees (plural) planted on both sides of the River, similar to that which we find in Ezk 47:12.

Assuming that this Tree is the same as the one found in Gen 3:22,24, two observations could be made:

- 1. Physical death would have been impossible if Adam and Eve had eaten from the Tree
- 2. Everlasting life required the eating of the fruit.

It must be noted that Adam and Eve were in a <u>natural state</u> and the occupants of the new earth are in a <u>resurrected state</u>.

The leaves of the tree are for "health giving" or to promote life in the New Jerusalem and are not for correcting ill health, which does not exist.

Again, "Nations" is a translation of the word for Gentiles.

Vs 3 Unlike the Millennial Earth, where the effects of sin will still be experienced from the standpoint of judgment, no such situation will exist in Eternity to come. All will have been raised or translated and all judgments will be behind the participants. Thus, there is no more curse, death, etc. Service to the King and not rebellion will be the experience of all!

NOTE: We will not only be "Sons of God", and His "bride", We will also be Bondservants and we will serve Him.

Vs 4-5 The Final Picture

- 1. We will see His face.
 - That which was true in the original creation must be different in the new. Ex 33:20
- 2. His Name will be on our foreheads we clearly belong to Him. Rev 7:3; 14:1; 3:12
- 3. There will no longer be any night. No more 1 John 2:8-11; Eph 6:12
- 4. Daylight
- 5. Reign forever and ever.
- 6. The age of Christ being our mediator is over. No advocate is needed. All things have been made new.

A.T. Piersom summarizes verses 3-5 as follows:
Perfect Restoration – There shall be no more curse.
Perfect Administration – The Throne of God and of the Lamb shall be in it.
Perfect Subordination – His bond-servants will serve Him.
Perfect Transformation – They will see His face.
Perfect Identification – His Name will be on their foreheads.
Perfect Illumination – No longer any night...no need for
Perfect Exultation – They will reign forever and ever

EPILOGUE

- Vs 6 The angel tells John "These revelations are faithful and true". The God of the prophets sent His angel Rev 1:1 to show His servants, through the Apostle John, the events which will shortly come to pass (must take place).
- Vs 7 When the action comes, which is recorded in this book, it will

be sudden. Blessed is he who...Rev 1:3 Note that the 1st and the 6th Beatitudes are the same.

- Vs 8-9 The Revelations received by John overwhelm him and he begins to worship the wrong created being. He is corrected – WORSHIP GOD!!!
- Vs 10 Unlike Dan 12:4, the words of this book are to remain open, With a blessing received for all who heed it! Rev 1:3 and 22:7 God will not conceal it!

We are living "in the time". The Church Age can be ended at any moment. There are no more phases to God's program. The next and final act will be the Tribulation Period and all will progress naturally until That Day arrives.

- Vs 11 If the prophecies of this book of Revelation are rejected, there is no other message from God. If the warnings of this book are not sufficient, there is no more that God has to say. The wicked must continue in their wickedness and be judged. The holy and righteous must continue with their way.
- Vs 12 "The Blessed Hope" and assurance of Reward is given. 2 Pet 3:10-13. The Believer will receive his reward "then" and not before. Heb 11:39-40; 2 Cor 5:10-11
- Vs 13-16 Though the means of communication is an angel, it is Christ Who has been speaking; Christ Who is the Alpha and Omega – The Almighty.

The final Beatitude of the book of Revelation is given: Those who wash their robes: 1. have a right to the Tree of Life

2. may enter by the gates into the City

Vs 15	The lost are described for the third time, Rev 21:8,27, and here. NOTE: The issue is not that these individuals have at some time committed sins, but rather that these terms describe their character; description which fits every human who has not been washed.

	In context and in light of all the other clear teachings of the Scripture, this passage would be directed to the unsaved and how they handle it not the saved.		
Vs 20	Again a Promise – Jesus Is Coming Quickly for the recipients of this "book" - the rapture would be Christ's focus.		

The Apostle John will be a part of that event. John's response to Jesus' promise – Amen. Come, Lord Jesus.

Vs 21 John's benediction is pronounced on the recipients of the letter. It has been written and sent to the churches. All therefore, is limited by context to those who belong to the churches which the book of Revelation was intended for.
