	We are not told what is written upon it but, in context,
	what it may have is the judgments that this angel is
	to carry out.
	They are summarized as the Seven Peals of Thunder.
	(Thunder means that the lightening has already
	struck.) God has chosen not to reveal them to mankind before
	their occurrence.

	NOTE: The fact that John was about to write the Seven
	Thunders down, means that he understood the revelation.
	CONCLUSION: This revelation was for John.
	God wanted him to know but not the rest of mankind.
