Around the Summer of AD 31 d(2 years have passed), Jesus was rejected by the religious
Leaders who attributed the displays of power in His ministry to Beelzebub Mk 3:19-30; Mtt 12:22-37
After this accusation, Jesus changed the focus of His ministry from the establishment of Israel's kingdom to the Kingdom of God in mystery form.

The "sign miracles" for Israel, as a population, ceased and He began teaching in Parables Mtt 12:38 – 13:17

Jesus leaves Capernaum and returns to
Jerusalem for the Feast of Tabernacles

[Oct 21-28 AD 31]

Returning to Galilee, Jesus sends out the

Twelve
